



Municipal FINANCIAL RELIEF



COVID-19 HAS HAD A FINANCIAL IMPACT ON OUR ENTIRE COMMUNITY, and with the increasing uncertainties it is placing on businesses and residents, City Council unanimously adopted the following measures as part of the COVID-19 related relief initiative:

- ✓ **Market Vendors** will be reimbursed for three weeks (of 4) in March, no fees for April.
- ✓ **Interest charges** are waived for Utility and Operating Accounts for March, April, May.
- ✓ **City parking lots** are opened and free until April 30.
- ✓ **Metered parking is free** of charge until April 30 (exception: metres in proximity to both hospitals).
- ✓ **Non-Sufficient Fund** (NSF) fees are waived for March, April, May.
- ✓ **Metered parking** near the hospitals are free of charge from 6pm to 7:45am on weekdays until April 30.
- ✓ **Water shut-off** process is suspended until May.
- ✓ **Sidewalk Patio Fees** are waived for 2020.

These measures were chosen in considering the gaps that exist with provincial and federal programs, in consultation with other municipalities, and based on feedback from residents and business.

The City recognizes that this pandemic will also have numerous financial implications on the City. As the situation evolves, we will keep the public informed about decisions taken by Council.
