2016 INDUCTEE Andrew "Sammy" SAMUEL MCMANUS

Athlete – Hockey

Born in Ireland, Sammy McManus played junior hockey in Toronto before moving to Eastern Canada where he played with the New Glasgow Tigers, Fredericton Capitals and Moncton Hawks. The Hawks won the Allan Cup in 1933 and again in 1934 with McManus netting 8 goals and 17 points in 12 games. He won the Stanley Cup with the Montreal Maroons in 1935. He was traded several times and played his last NHL game with the Boston Bruins in 1937. In 1946-47, he played his final season of hockey with the Moncton Hawks, where he produced one of the best offensive seasons of his career, 37 goals and 71 points in 32 games.
