Scott **FRASER**

Athlete – Hockey

Scott Fraser started his minor hockey career in 1972 with the Moncton Minor Hockey Association. It was apparent from the start that he had a tremendous amount of natural talent. In 1991 he was drafted in the 9th round by the Montreal Canadiens but continued his career with Dartmouth College. In 98 games, he scored 59 goals and 53 assists, and left Dartmouth with his MBA in Economics. He turned pro with the Canadiens in 1994 and spent the next few seasons between the AHL and NHL with Montreal and Calgary. In 1997, Scott joined the Edmonton Oilers where he was named NHL Rookie of the Month twice. He finished that season as the top Oiler rookie scorer with 23 points in 29 games, good for 6th in the league among rookie scorers. He retired from hockey in 1998.
