Shane SCUTT

Builder – Motorcycle Racing

At the age of 12, Shane witnessed his first motocross race. Learning to ride a motorcycle on a race track, he rose through the ranks from 80cc School-boy in 1977 to the premier class of 250 Expert by 1982, winning five Atlantic Canadian motocross championships and six Atlantic ice racing titles along the way. In 1983, he switched to pavement and earned four Atlantic Road Racing Championships and a third place at the Canadian National level. In 1984, Shane earned his Pro license and was a regular on the podium in his rookie Pro year. In 1997 he moved to California to fulfill his dream of racing American Dirt Track. In his rookie year he won the Southern California 600 Sportsman title. In 1998 he earned four AMA Pro victories. Shane became a champion in all the major forms of motorcycle racing. It was in supermoto that he capped off a thirty year racing career with two 2006 Canadian national titles as well as a victory in the New York Grand Prix.
