Builder – Hockey, Golf and Curling

Cecil "Cece" Peake had a profound impact on sports in the Moncton area. He played a major role in hockey, curling and golf beginning in the 1930s until his death in 1965. Through a family connection in Western Canada, he lured hockey players to Moncton, who became the nucleus of the Moncton Hawks who then went on to win the Allan Cup. He is also known for his association with the Lakeside Golf Club, where he was a larger than life individual. As a result, Lakeside became the social spot for the region's sports figures. Cecil was also involved in various curling activities and had an important role in the hosting of the first Brier held in Moncton in 1956.
