1984 was a banner year for the Moncton Tim Hortons Midgets Baseball Team. Coached by Dale Somers, the team won the majority of that season's Southeastern NB Bison League games, scoring 180 runs in 16 games and allowing their opposition only 76 runs. Their success was a result of many years of teamwork, with many of the players having started with Somers as 11 and 12-year old in 1979. In 1984, the team captured the Canadian Midget Baseball Championship, a first for a Moncton team in the midget division. Two members of the team, Matt Stairs and Rhéal Cormier went on to play major league baseball for teams such as the Atlanta Braves and the Toronto Blue Jays.
