Moncton **HAWKS** (1932-1933 / 1933-1934)

Team – Hockey

In 1934, after their second, consecutive Allan Cup win, more than 15 000 fans welcomed the Moncton Hawks home. Described as the best in its day outside the NHL, the team was coached by Percy Nicklin and managed by Ambrose Wheeler. The first in the Maritimes to win the Allan Cup, the team went on to win the North American championship against Detroit in 1934 and thus earned itself a place in the NB Sports Hall of Fame.
