Moncton **MAROONS** (1935-1939)

Team – Hockey

Formed in 1935, the Moncton Maroons were a championship hockey team, winning three straight Maritime titles, the first in their inaugural season. Formed after the demise of the Moncton Hawks, the team relied on local players who had worked their way through school and junior ranks. Owned by Henry White and coached by Harold "Dud" James, the Moncton Maroons were champions until their final season in 1938-39.
