Moncton **RED INDIANS** (1932-1933)

Team – Hockey

During the early 1930s, Moncton was privileged to have a championship Junior hockey team. The Moncton Red Indians were Provincial and Maritime Champions and the first such New Brunswick team to compete for the Memorial Cup—an amazing feat considering the population of Moncton at the time. Following their disappointing semi-final loss to the Montreal Royals in a (5-4) two-game, total goal series, (3-3 and 2-1) the quality of Moncton area talent was recognized in the major markets of Quebec and Ontario.

Honourable mention is also warranted for the team of 1934-35. Only five Moncton teams have competed for the prestigious Memorial Cup with this Depression era team being the second to make such a pursuit.
