The **CARROLL FAMILY** (1920-1922)

Team – Hockey

The Carroll family name is legendary in Maritime hockey circles, thanks to a father and eight sons who were all pros on the ice. During the 1920s, the Carrolls were members of the Maritime Independent League semi-pro hockey team, the Victorias. The Moncton team claimed two championships in the 1920-22 seasons, scoring that feat in part because there were so many Carrolls on the team. The Carroll men further demonstrated their skill when they formed their own hockey team at the end of the pro-season and beat the Victorias in two exhibition games. Led by Fred Sr., brothers Jack, George, Harold, Blair, Cecil, Tom, Fred Jr. and Ken went on to play, coach and referee hockey for many years. To honour the family's hockey history, one of Moncton's 4-Ice rinks bears the Carroll name.
